Other ideas in need of further discussion:

- Importance of all six elements of ACE.
- Whole-of-society approaches.
- How different groups of people are represented in the current action plan under the Glasgow work programme and how to reflect this consistently.
- National ACE focal points and their greater involvement in decision-making and reporting processes at the national level.
- Financial and technical support for implementing ACE.
- Secretariat, Parties and others to make efforts to make available information and materials in a timely, accessible manner – science-based, traditional and Indigenous knowledge systems, universally accessible.
- Information integrity.]
