This informal note has been prepared by the co-facilitators for these agenda items at these sessions under their own responsibility and has no formal status. It is an attempt by the co-facilitators to capture the discussions under these agenda items at SB64. This informal note does not prejudge the draft decision that will be prepared at SB 65 (November 2026) and forwarded for consideration and adoption at CMA 8 (November 2026), nor does it prejudge further work or prevent Parties from expressing their views at any time. It does not represent agreement among Parties and is without prejudice to the text that will form the basis of negotiations.
